Dates for Distribution this month; June 10 and June 24

- Changes in the food distribution as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak.
 Arrive at the fire hall between 11:45 and 12:30, park in the parking lot, do
- not leave your vehicle until instructed to do so, to receive your number.If you are a first time patron, you will be required to submit an ID and paid utility bill to verify residence.
- Do not bring your own boxes or bags, they will be provided at the site.
 - No patron will be allowed into the fire hall so there will be no public restroom available.
- If you are picking up for someone else, please let volunteer know so a separate box can be prepared. There is one box allowed for each household.
- Boxes will be prepacked. When your number is called, you will drive to the open door on 76 to receive your box. Remain in your vehicle.
- The first distribution of food using this plan went well and there have been Bonus Dates added to serve the community.
- **BONUS DATES**: June 10, July 15, August 12, September 16, October 14, November 11, December 16.
- NORMAL DATES: June 24, July 29, August 26, September 30, October 28, November 25, December 30,

We hope this finds you well and healthy during this unique time. Even now, the revolving door of dogs does not stop at Northern Chautauqua Canine Rescue (NCCR), and surprisingly it is revolving even faster! With extra time on their hands, people find it to be a good time to adopt a dog. There is more time for training and socializing, which is wonderful, as long as people also realize that at some point life will change back to a more "normal" state and a pet is a lifetime commitment. Try and make sure every day that you spend time away from your dog; otherwise they might develop separation anxiety when you go back to work!

While we are closed to the public except by appointment for adoptions, we are still taking in dogs. We receive local strays, approved turnovers from people who can't care for their dog for one reason or another, and we also take in dogs from overcrowded shelters or puppy mills where they have run out of time.
