Construction Begins!

Work has finally begun on the Ripley Public Library renovation. It's not often you get to

see the bare bones of an historic building, but here you can see the original beams and supports of the 1st Baptist church that became our hometown library.

Unfortunately, as is bound to happen with a building almost 130 years old, some of the original beams have rotted and need to be replaced or "sistered" with new beams.





Old buildings often hold secrets and the Baptist church turned Ripley Library is no exception. Who knew the old staircase behind the circulation desk hid another stairway going into the basement! It will be repaired and become the "new" stairway to the depths of the building.

The existing stairways will be torn out and replaced with beautiful new stairways with spindle railings.





Construction, continued

Construction methods and materials change over time, but the library staff was quite taken with the beauty of the original walls, as here you see on the east side of the former sanctuary. Tearing down the lathe has revealed a stunning structure beneath. Eventually the covered parts of the stained glass windows will be opened to reveal their brilliance.

It's a shame the building cannot be restored to its original beauty, but it will be an impressive, light filled, functional library when completed.





In anticipation of the third balcony being built, secure footers were added in the basement to hold the weight of the library's nonfiction collection, as well as some of the stacks. Neither

of the existing balconies were constructed with that kind of weight load in mind, although they are per-

fectly safe for meeting rooms and social gatherings.

Balcony windows and walls facing into the library have been removed and secure flooring installed. Spindle railings



will be added and the peaks of the ceilings will be maintained throughout.



September Gardening

September is the perfect time to begin work on your yard before the weather turns cooler. The following tips were found on the hgtv.com website and are listed below.

- Plant fall annuals such as pansies or violas
- Prune Hibiscus
- Start mulching around strawberries
- Mow your leaves and attach a grass catcher to spread as mulch on your veggie garden
- Pick a last group of herbs that you want to dry
- Clean up your veggie patch discarding any plant debris
- Divide your Irises and Day Lilies
- Reseed the lawn
- Harvest your late summer squash and gourds
- Freeze your late summer crops such as peppers, corn or beans
- Replenish raised beds with compost and rich organic soil
- Pick Apples

Adventures in Politics Land

Women's Suffrage Day

In my second year as a state representative, a bill came before the ED&A Committee for a public hearing. The sponsor of the bill did not show up to introduce it. A few members of the public spoke in favor of the bill, and one person opposed it. The Bill was to create a new state holiday, August 26, the anniversary of the passing of the 19th Amendment to the US Constitution, to be known as Women's Suffrage Day. The hearing closed quickly, and we were off to the next public hearing. It was a busy day with several hearings on our agenda, and once they ended, the chairman suggested we go into executive session and dispense with those bill that would be easy decisions, starting with Women's Suffrage Day.

Someone made a comment that while it was a nice sentiment, we already had enough state holidays, and besides, the sponsor didn't even show up to support her bill. Just as the chairman was about to gavel a motion of Inexpedient to Legislate, my hand went up, as if someone else was controlling it. I had no idea what I would say, only that suddenly I felt the urgent need to say something.

I stuttered out, "Mr. Chairman, I don't think we should just dismiss such an important occasion," My voice trailed off, and my face grew red, because it wasn't like me to raise my hand and contribute especially on a topic I hadn't thought a lot about.

Immediately another hand went up. It was my mentor Howard, who smiled towards me from the other side of the table, and said, "I agree, she's correct that we should acknowledge the momentous occasion when women were given the right to vote."

Up went my hand again, and this time I knew the words that were coming. "Mr. Chairman, I appreciate my colleague's support, but the fact is women were not <u>given</u> the right to vote; they always had the right to vote. This amendment forced men to acknowledge that right." Everyone started talking, and the easy bill to dispense with turned into a long debate. It was ultimately found Inexpedient to Legislate anyway. The chairman announced that since I had so much passion about the subject I should write the House Report. I knew I was being punished for wasting the committee's time. So

much for Women's Suffrage Day.

It was not the last time I would hear about this subject in a political discussion. Two years later I was invited to a political training session, unaware that I was about to be witness to behind-the-scenes strategic planning. In private and surrounded by like-minded thinkers, people tend to let their guard down and say things they might otherwise withhold. Such was the case with one of the speakers to this group. He reminded me of a smaller version of Harrison Ford in Indiana Jones. Like a college professor, he put his hands behind his back, paced to and fro in front of the audience, lamenting the political state of our country. At one point he stopped and looked out into the audience and pronounced, "All our troubles began when women were given the right to vote!"

I was astonished. Then I noticed that I didn't see any other women in attendance. "Excuse me," I said from the table where I sat near the back of the room.

He squinted his eyes and peered into the audience to see from whence this voice came. To make it clear to him, I stood up, and repeated, "Excuse me."

He seemed puzzled, then with a wave of his hand simply said, "present company excluded." What did that even mean? I couldn't imagine anyone would believe such a sentiment, much less actually state it out loud. He had the right audience. No one else said a word.

A few years later as a state senator, I was a guest on a political talk show. The host, Woody Woodland, was one of the best interviewers I'd encountered, but he was stumped when one of the local state representatives called to disagree with my comments. We were discussing taxes, a subject I was passionate about and had considerable expertise. This state rep was all bluster and little substance and liked to claim the constitution as his substantiation for his viewpoint.

I signaled to Woody, let me take this, which he gratefully acknowledged. I explained to this state representative the origin of our state's tax structure was our state constitution to which he replied, "And nowhere in our constitution does it give women the right to vote or to hold public office!"

Woody was shocked, but I smiled and replied, "And I bet you'd like to go back to that, wouldn't you?"

"Yes - I - would." He articulated each word emphatically.

We laughed so hard we had to go to break. But isn't it sad that such sentiment still exists nearly a hundred years after the adoption of the 19th Amendment?

The plane developed engine failure, crashing on the side of a snow covered mountain. Neither were injured badly, but both did have painful scrapes and bruises.


Throughout the interminable wait for possible rescue, the two developed a working relationship, Heather encouraging the pilot and the pilot caring for Heather in any way necessary.

The Day the Freezer Died **Rhonda** Thompson

So what do you do when your freezer stops working during a pandemic?

I have (had) a 14 cubic foot freezer about 2/3 of the way filled with food and badly in need of defrosting. I went out to the garage to see how much stuff was in there when I noticed that most of the ice was gone and water was dripping from the bottom. I thought I had lost all my food. By the way this would not be the first time this happened to me. Many years ago someone did not close the door all the way and all the meat thawed out and spoiled. This time, however, the food was thawing, but still partially frozen and still good. I immediately closed the door to keep the cold in as long as possible. I called Lowes, Home Depot and several other places. There were no freezers available. Home Depot said they haven't had freezers for months. Now I really didn't know what to do. So I stuffed what I could in my refrigerator freezer and started cooking the rest. I had two turkeys; I gave one away and put the other in my daughter's freezer.

I cooked for two days straight. I got very creative with my culinary skills. I chopped onions, celery and peppers. I made meatballs, cooked and packaged them in bags. This took up less room. I cleaned out the refrigerator freezer and made room for the cooked meat I was putting together. Cooked food, it turns out, takes up less room than when you buy it in the package and freeze it. I made meatloaves, cooked and refroze them. I cooked two half hams and gave them to my kids. I made Swiss steak, I sliced a mostly frozen beef roast very thin to use later for steak sandwiches. I grilled several steaks outside and froze them to make soup with later. I have a lot of soup starter. I cooked chicken and

made Italian Wedding soup. I made chicken salad and canned three jars of chicken broth. I cooked a turkey breast and gave half of it to my grandsons, who loved it. I made turkey salad with the rest. I got a quart of turkey broth to can as well. I cooked a pork loin and turned it in to barbequed pulled pork. I did that with some chicken too. With other cuts of beef, I just cut them in chunks added salt and water and canned it as well. If you have never eaten canned beef before, you are missing out on a wonderful treat.

I was so annoyed when this first happened. But what else can you do. So I took the old adage "when life gives you lemons, make lemonade." So that is what I did. Although tiring, all of that cooking and getting creative in the kitchen was rather stimulating and I now have a freezer full of easy to cook food. The meatloaves just need heated through, spaghetti and meatballs will be so simple this winter. Pulled pork and barbequed chicken will make an easy lunch. There are now so many great meal starters.

The next time life throws you lemons make it work in your favor. Remember there is no great loss without some small gain. Keep a positive outlook and things work out.

By the way, if you are in the market for a freezer, you may have to wait a while. Some products are scarce during a pandemic.

I hope you take some of my ideas to help you think of what to cook. Get creative and think of new ways to cook things. Try different spices, baking instead of frying or wrap veggies in foil and put them on the grill. I just gave you lots of ideas. Now go cook something, I know you are hungry.


