Former Police officer and widower, Paul Thompson, has come to Pleasant Shores on Chesapeake Bay to recover and seek treatment for PTSD. He and his son, Davey, are well received by the residents of the town, including author Amber Rowe, her sister, Julie and her husband Trey, who is the police officer in Pleasant Shores.

Paul recognized Amber as the author who had interviewed and written part of his wife's story before she had succumbed to cancer last year.

Friendships were formed with other members of the village. Paul and Davey seemed to fit right in and were accepted by the others.

During the interview, Amber had been told a secret by his wife and had promised to never share it. Amber agonized over whether to divulge the information to Paul. As they became better acquainted and Davey bonded with Amber and some of the children of the town, her decision became more difficult.

How all of this played out along with the involvement by the whole town to provide safe homes for PTSD and victims of violent crime, makes this book difficult to put down until you reach the end.






