Sustaining the Momentum

The Town of Ripley has multiple projects that will soon be coming to fruition. This brief article will describe those projects.

Love's Travel Center

Water 5 and Sewer 2 running East from Stateline on Route 5, up Shortman Rd and connecting to the Water and Sewer lines in the Hamlet has been completed. Residents are currently being hooked up. This project has attracted Love's Travel Center to Shortman Road and it is likely additional development will follow. Love's is scheduled for a January 29, 2022, completion. Water 5 and Sewer 2 also will allow expansion for Regal Trucking and will save the Campgrounds and Pines Motel on Rte 5 from closure. Plummer's is scheduled for reopening in the Spring of 2022. All this would not be possible without Town Water and Sewer.

Love's Travel Center will contribute an additional \$165,000 yearly to the tax base through a Host Community Agreement for the next 25 years and then will go on the regular property tax roll. The Host Community Agreement will allow the Town to use the money to assist financing of Water and Sewer projects. Regular property tax revenue cannot be used to finance water and sewer projects. Love's will also increase our revenue through dramatically increased Sales tax income.

Other Projects

Financing has been released and contracts awarded for Water to be extended to Shorehaven as well as replacement of Sewer lines on West Main Street. Work will also begin on repairs and upgrades to the Sewer Plant. Repairs on Belson Dam at the Reservoir have been completed.

Solar Projects

The Application for the Connectgen South Ripley Solar Project has been submitted to the NYS Siting Board and substantial feedback requiring changes to the application have been provided to Connectgen. The link to the feedback is on the Town of Ripley website. Town OF RIPLEY, NY - Home (ripleyny.org) The Town Board does not determine whether this project moves forward, the NYS Site Siting Board is charged with the approval or rejection of the project application. The Town is charged with negotiating PILOT (Payment in Lieu of Taxes) and Host Community Agreement.

A similar 270 megawatt project in the Town of Byron in Genesee County will generate \$1 million per year for 25 years. That is the baseline for Town of Ripley negotiations. Such an agreement would allow the Town of Ripley, if we choose, to virtually eliminate the Town property tax levy. It also opens up many other options such as budgeting for contingencies, setting up a reserve fund for town equipment so that we do not have to borrow money every time a new plow truck is necessary, or setting up a budget line to provide match for projects that are available to improve the Town but are beyond our reach because we cannot currently afford a 25% or 50 % match.

These decisions must be made with transparency. Suggestions from the public are more than welcome. Despite COVID restrictions, attendance at Board meetings has increased (Zoom has allowed greater public input and will be continued). Anyone wishing to attend Town Board Meetings via Zoom can simply contact the Town Clerk's office.

We will also need to have a Town Board with the knowledge and skills to prudently manage projects and write and administer grants. I urge all voters to come out on election day and support those candidates who have been involved in putting together the plans that have put the Town on the path to growth, so that we can seamlessly sustain the momentum we have achieved.

All the potential changes in the Town makes it essential that we update our Town Comprehensive plan. The Town has applied for a grant to assist us in the process.
