Brew Chamber at the Mill in Ripley, New York, has been a great hit among area locals.

Adam Chambers undertook the daunting task of converting the old Ripley Coal and Feed Mill into a successful brew pub. He salvaged materials from buildings being torn down, such as the mileage sign from the Colonial Squire before the building was demolished to make room for Love's Truck Stop, as well as other signage and mechanical items from various places.

"I serve New York State craft beers and wines as well as New York State liquors. I made hard cider during apple season and sold out!," Chambers said. More cider is coming he assured us.

Currently the Mill has a select menu of appetizers, sandwiches, and sides. Live music rocks the place on Saturday nights. A new pool table has just arrived and future plans include more hours with Pool Night, as well as Trivia Night, which will feature wine country trivia.

Adam has big plans for the future of Brew Chamber. Stayed tuned.





TEFAP INCOME GUIDELINES
(Updated February 1, 2021)

A person is eligible for food assistance if they verbally attest that they fall into one of the following categories

a.) If the person's income falls within the following guidelines, they are eligible for food assistance.

b.) If the person or someone in their household participates in one of the following assistance programs: SNAP, WIC, TANF, Unemployment, Disability, SSI or Free/Reduced lunch program.

Household Size	Annually
1	\$25,760
2	\$34,840
3	\$43,920
4	\$53,000
5	\$62,080
6	\$71,160
7	\$80,240
8	\$89,320
For families/households with more than 8 persons, add \$4,540 for each additional person	\$9,080
