Ripley Literary Club



A reader wrote in and asked about the Ripley Literary Club that met at the old Oddfellows building next to Rice's Hardware. She wondered if the club still exists, so we did a little research.

The Literary Club no longer exists, but records and minutes of those meetings are here at the

Ripley Public Library! The Literary Club was founded in 1893 by Mary E. Wethy, who served as president from 1893-1898. Copious minutes and reports by the women of the club can be found at the library.

Following is the Forward to the 70-year tribute to the club in 1963.

"If, when an organization attains the age of half a century, nay—seventy years, of continuous existence, it seems only fitting and proper that some effort should be made to record some of the reasons for its continued success. This volume, therefore, will be such an attempt.

"The Ripley Literary Club was formed as a study group, with the idea in mind that many could cover a wider area of topics than could individuals, while at the same time having the companionship of their neighbors, and incidentally had fun together.

"The Ripley Literary Club may have been the brain child of Mrs. Mary E. Wethy but from the roster of names of those who have belonged for these many years, it is plain that many have benefited




from the programs, both in cultural advancement and social contact.

"Rules were more strict sixty years ago than today. Each member needed a very good excuse for absence. A critic was appointed by the president and actually did criticize, constructively as well as adversely, the papers and talks given by the members. This kept everyone on her toes to make her presentation without flaw and as nearly perfect as possible.

"... program topics were varied and interspersed with music, religion, pertinent subjects of national interest, and book reviews."

There are three large 3-ring binders containing the reports these women made to their group, as well as to the public. In fact, it was a highlight of the year to present these essays to the community.

While looking through the Literary Club files we also found a cache of little books published by D. H. Knowlton & Co. called Our Little People Library. The booklets we have here start in 1901, and that edition is listed as the "Fourteenth Year."

These little gems are a combination of stories and lessons available for a mere 35 cents. One edition in 1911 recounts the story of Tom, Dick, and Harry looking at a bunch of cigarettes, called "What's the Harm."

The library is a treasure trove of history! Come take a look.





This painting hung over the fireplace at the Ripley Inn.


This gem was brought to the Town Historian's office by the daughter-in-law of the former owners of the Ripley Inn.


