



HOLIDAY PORTRAIT TIPS FROM A PROFESSIONAL

The holidays don't have to be a headache! Getting those picture perfect memories is easy if you plan ahead. Here are a few tips to help you get though the season.

- Coordinate those colors! Did you know that solid colored clothing photographs the best? Dark colors tend
 to take weight off of you, light colors can add weight. If you can't wear the same shade of one color, then opt
 for the same color family. All warms colors or choose all cool colors. Stay away from those busy patterns.
- 2. Beware of those cheap mini sessions! Many new photographers with little experience offer those 15 minute minis for a discounted price. Ask to see actual samples of their work and make sure they aren't advertising "borrowed" inspiration photos from other photographers.
- 3. If you do opt for a photographer that offers digital files, be careful of using drug store or box store photo labs. Sometimes the guy who was selling tires last week is working the photo department this week. Give an online lab a try. I recommend Mpix.com or in a pinch, Shutterfly.
- 4. Let your photographer get the children's attention! It can be hard to not jump in but you have to trust the process. A good photographer will have tricks up their sleeve to get your little one to look. If the child is torn between 2 people trying to ge ttheir attention, they will choose the parent and then they're not looking at the camera. Or worse, half are looking straight on and half somewhere else.
- 5. Let the moments happen. Sometimes the best images are not looking right at the camera. The holidays are all about the magic and wonder of the season. Let's get those images where they are shaking that package, or reading that storybook. They will never be this little again.

Training completed by our members:

- On September 12, 2023 Members reviewed and trained on Radio use and traffic safety.
- On September 29, 2023 Members trained on responding to OD and review scene safety while responding to incidents, with a special emphasis on the dangers of fentanyl.
- On October 10, 2023 Member performed turnout gear inspections on all of their issues protective gear.
- On October 17, 2023 Member participated in a review / trainings on HazMat response.
- October 19-22, 2023 A big "THANK YOU" to our Fire Commissioners for allowing us to send a member to represent Ripley Hose to the four-day, New York State, Vital Signs Training Conference. New York State mandated patient care procedures were reviewed as well as many hours spent on learning new patient care procedures. Lieutenant Babcock also attended briefings on new (and possibly new) New York State Emergency Medical Service's up and coming administrative policy and procedure changes. 16 hours of class time was completed pertaining to Basic Life Support skills for patients. Additionally, 14 hours of basic training were also completed in chemical and radiation burns, chest traumas, patient care report documentation, overdose response, pediatric assessment, and managing mental health for first responders.

Information was attained for possible community outreach programs to teach poison awareness and prescription medication danger to the children in our community with the assistance of NYS Poison Control.

This conference is organized by NYS Department of Health. Over time, all of these trainings and updates will be presented to our full membership after being vetted and prioritized by Chief Smith.

Thank you, Ripley Fire Commissioners, for sending us to this conference. We don't say it enough, but we truly appreciate all of our Fire Commissioners and their hard work.


